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
There is no such a thing as "the *perfect* educational programme" for secondary students for the discovery and interpretation of heritage site. Why? The reason is simple - everyone is different! The diversity of school systems and heritage materials that can be used for educational purposes varies from country to country and does not allow for a single univocal solution.

BUT... There are some aspects to consider and certain questions to ask yourself and your partner institution before you design such a programme. Identifying these aspects can you when contacting a heritage institution for the very first time.

What are the expectations and what are the options? Do we really know what the other one wants? How do we integrate extracurricular activities into the school curriculum? What makes heritage discovery a real experience? How can the student find his/her own personal connection with the heritage? When do we need to give guidance to students and when do we need to give them freedom? How much freedom students need in different phases of the programme? During the learning process, what is the role of the teacher, the heritage expert and the student? Why is cooperation important?

Many questions, one answer: TRAME methodology.

TRAME MANUAL ABSTRACT

The main result of the TRAME project is the methodology manual for teachers and heritage educators. The book contains a description of an educational methodology that can promote the active involvement of secondary students in the discovery and interpretation of heritage sites. It contains 26 examples of good practices that showcase innovative methodological approaches, cooperation between cultural and educational institutions and heritage sites, and active involvement of students. The book also examines the possibilities of including heritage education programmes in the school curriculum. In the manual, the authors have dedicated a separate chapter to highlighting the main elements of collaboration of teachers and heritage. The backbone of the book is a detailed presentation of 4 educational programmes, which were designed and implemented by heritage experts, museum educators, instructors, educators, cultural programme organizers and teachers from Italy, Serbia, Turkey and Hungary with high school students. This chapter is above all a practical guide and inspiration for those who want to implement an educational and cultural institution.

HUNGARY



The Association of Cultural Heritage Managers, the József Hajnóczy Dormitory and the World Heritage Department of the Zsolnay Heritage Management Nonprofit Ltd. held a book launch of the *TRAME Manual for teachers and heritage educators* on the 28th September, 2022 at the Kodály Center in Pécs. As part of the event, there were lectures, an exhibition and a workshop.

The purpose of the event was to present the results of the TRAME project: the content and purpose of the TRAME Manual, as well as the educational programmes implemented in Pécs, which were designed and implemented by teachers, heritage experts and educators with local secondary students first and then with international students, as part of a student mobility exchange program.

During the event, the students and the teachers organised their own exhibition displaying all works they created within the educational path. These creative results tell the story of their personal relation with Roman heritage and their interpretation of all that they experienced in order to discover contemporary and personal meanings in it.

After the lectures, the participants could try the board game "Never ending journey" that was created jointly by the Turkish, Serbian and Hungarian students participating in the student exchange programmes.

Invited participants and guests came from educational and cultural institutions, public and civil organisations and archaeological sites, including many university professors from the field of Classical Studies, students from the University of Pécs interested in heritage education, heritage management and heritage interpretation, secondary school teachers and students, museum educators, heritage specialists, heritage educators, archaeologists and representatives of the local municipality and local TV stations. There were also foreign students (Russia, Nepal, Morocco, Turkey, Georgia) from the Faculty of Humanities of the Eötvös Loránd University (Budapest) and the participants from the Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree program on cultural heritage. There were approximately 60 participants at the event.

Additional program was held on 29th of September for the foreign students from the Faculty of Humanities of the Eötvös Loránd University (Budapest), studying cultural heritage (MA). This event included a study tour on the World Heritage site of Pécs and Early Christian Cemetery of Pécs (Sopianae).



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ITALY



TRAME. Incontro sulle migrazioni dall'antichità ad oggi

This was the title of the Multiplier event held in Curia Iulia at Roman forum on 3rd of October, Italian national migration day.

Director of <u>Parco archeologico del Colosseo</u> Alfonsina Russo opened the event and announced the TRAME manual session in which speakers were Francesca Boldrighini from Parco archeologico del Colosseo, Diana Hermann from World Heritage Pécs, Michela Nocita from Liceo Classico Pilo Albertelli, Rome and Jelena Anđelković Grašar from the Institute of Archaeology, Belgrade.

The second part, "OUT of TRAME" had the aim to extend the outlook out of TRAME project to hear and speak about other projects connected with the topic of migrations, ancient and modern ones. Our guest speakers were Francesca Di Pasquale, from the State Archive of Palermo, Sicily, which held an enlightening speech about migrations from Sicily towards north Africa, and Claudio Gnessi, Director of Ecomuseo Casilino, who spoke about M.A.U.Mi, the first project of public art focused on migrations.

Silvia Proietti, from Piùculture, focused on migrants and citizenship rights today in Italy, and finally Antonella Corea, School director, and Flavia di Gregorio, from the council of the city of Rome closed the event with the importance of conveying the topic to the young generations.

Finally, students from Liceo Albertelli guided the public to the Roman Forum, with explanations in English and Italian focusing on the monuments related to the presence of strangers in the area.

About 100 people attended the event, among them students of the nearby schools, but also from Universities and other offices of the Ministry of Culture. Among the public there was the Ambassador of Turkey in Italy Mr. Ömer Gücük and the Director of the Hungarian Academy in Rome, who expressed their great interest in TRAME manual and activities.
